From Our Founder



So congratulations once again. Have a great time. On On. Caryl Gurney (Mrs G)



The 2,000th run is a momentous event. Not many hash clubs have got that far, only the Singapore Hash House Harriers have run longer in Singapore and only six Harriets clubs world-wide are "older" than us. Michael goes on to say that "the workload would fall back on the same half-dozen people, a large percentage of whom would be Associate members." Fortunately, in the case of this run we had a nice balanced contribution of members and associate members.

Our aim and hope has been to provide a fun event that everyone can enjoy, including the fabulous people who have put time and effort into organizing. I would like to extend thanks on your behalf to those people.

Shoe Shopper & Wet Patch, who not only hared the medium run, but also hosted many of the committee meetings in the bar of Ridgewood Condo (don't try the fish sauce omelet). Shoe Shopper, a former GM, was also pretty efficient at keeping the meetings on track...

Ugly Bum (also a former GM) & **Ad Nauseum** made a huge contribution by storing all the wine and managing not to drink too much of it. Ad Nauseum did a fantastic job of keeping our budget on track ("you want to spend how much on decorations?" with an incredulous look). And of course, they hared the short run.

Loose Change & Zipp did a fabulous job with the shirts among many other things. Loose Change is contributing and mixing the amazing punch (try it), after run refreshments, and decorations. Zipp and Gypsy bought all the wine for Ad Nauseum's office girls not to drink.

Wet Brazilian, our current GM, stunned us all with a live demonstration of the decorations in our penultimate committee meeting, sending the men on the committee to drink. Big Head hared the long run with **Virginia Slim** (I am sure you are all still out there and will read this if and when you get back).

Wet 'n Wild as secretary occasionally took the minutes, arranged the committee dance, and took charge of on the day registration. **Sneaky Comer** did the magazine, took the minutes when Wet 'n Wild wasn't doing them, and tried very unsuccessfully to keep Wet 'n Wild on track and sober during committee meetings. He also tracked registrations and will be off to Rio as soon as the takings are added up.

Herr Zipp agreed to be our DJ for the night and spent many long hours putting a track list together. Stiffener, as usual, did a ton of running around quietly but not unnoticed. Thanks also to Boxer, Stiffy, Kannot Kan and Kan the Kobra for providing various things we need on the day.

As for the magazine, thanks for the photos to Kannot Kan who supplied 32GB of photos (yes members, they are around somewhere), Loose Change, Anne Mette Boe via Facebook, Impossible, Deeper Valley, Pecker Checker, Big Head, Not Tonight, Caryl Gurney, and Confucius for filling a gap in the archive for the 70's. Some of the photos supplied are from Father An*s, so some people have found a way to get them from him. As for the content, that is Sneaky Comer's responsibility and my sincere apologies for any errors or omissions. My almost good lawyer is Boo.


MESSAGE TO HASH HOUSE HARRIETS FROM HASH HOUSE HARRIERS

Then, soon after, the Harriets were officially formed with the first run on Wednesday 17th October 1973. We believe that our first joint run with the Harriets was Run 628 on 14 January 1974 at the Swiss Club.

In our archives we do have a couple of pictures of the hare that is purported to have set your first run, Ratnam Narayanasamy, which we thought you might find of interest. One is from around 1973 and the other a recent photo from 2009.

How it all began—the 1970's

The first Harriets was Wednesday October 17, 1973. The run started at 5:45pm as the time zone in Singapore at the time was 30 minutes behind where it is now (today, this would make a 6:15pm start). The run started at the corner of Dover Road and Clementi Road, opposite Kent Cinema (now expunged). One of the hares, at least, was Ratnam Narayanasamy from HHHS, there were others as well but no-one can remember who.

The notice of the run was published in the HHHS newsletter announcing their 615th run, around the 10th October 1973.

Our running history has been recorded quite well over the years, which is remarkable. Mary Jane was a great custodian of Harriets records including old newsletters which is allowing us to record our history. Efforts so far are maintained in a database on our web site, which is available at <http://www.singaporeharriets.com> (Circle Reports). So far we have record all runs up to 1981 and from 2007 to present.

Our Early History by those who were there

HISTORY OF LADIES HASHING IN SINGAPORE.

My main reasons for starting the Ladies Hash are as set out in the 'First 100' which is enclosed. It must be realised that there was tremendous opposition from some of the men on the Mens' Hash. They seemed to think that we wanted to take over their Hash and therefore ruin their 'boys night out'. I was however lucky in that Ian Trumble, John Sheridan and Ratnam, were not agin us.

The first run was in October 1973 and was organised, at my request, by the then Joint Masters of Singapore Mens Hash, they being Ian Trumble, Ratnam and John Sheridan who may have been Secretary at that time, but I am not sure. The run was at Dover Road and possibly went over Kent Ridge. The men agreed to lay a run as a one off, "to see what the reaction would be". Approximately 12 runners gathered for the 1st run, the majority seemed to be from Changi, Annabelle Tame and myself being the only ones to continue as the rest were never seen again. Obviously it was a success and was followed by Run 2 which was held at Upper Thompson Road, so my husband informs me. The turn out was small, being myself husband, the hare and a few other ladies. We did however do the run.

John Sheridan laid the 3rd run out on the Jurong Road assisted by Annabelle Tame and myself, who were students of the honourable art on laying runs.

Officials.

First officials were myself as Secretary and Annabelle Tame as Hash Cash. I remained Secretary on and off for a long time and was finally made Grand Hash Mistress around about 100 runs by the then Joint Mistresses.

Zabi Burt and Jane Bodner were long time Hash Cashes, interspersed with having babies. Zabi was the first Hash Cash to introduce proper records for Hash subscriptions. Initially subs were collected each week, the sub being about 50 cents, but as numbers grew this task became too erroneous and a monthly sub was introduced, and we finally progressed to a 3 monthly sub. The monthly sub was \$5 and this covered the cost of beer, paper and postage. Initially the hare always brought the beer and was reimbursed by Hash Cash, but again as numbers increased this became a problem, and so at around 100 runs we arranged for Fraser and Neave to follow us as they did for the Mens' Hash.

Objectives.

My initial objective was to have the Hash for ladies only but found that this was not possible. Not many of those early pioneers relished the thought of running through a Kampong full of snarling dogs without a male body guard. I was always determined to keep men out as they did already have their own Hash and this had been started specifically for the ladies. This situation was not helped by the fact that the Mens' Hash closed and started a waiting list, and thought they could run with us whilst awaiting entry. In fact they were a nuisance, crashing past us, splashing mud, doing the checks and apart from that I was concerned they might take over. I was also determined that all the officials would be women. Eventually we made it a rule that approx. 6 men could be made official members of our hash and each lady member was only allowed to bring 1 male guest, whether he be, boyfriend, lover, husband etc.

On Ons.

As far as I can remember the first On On was at Ian Trumble's abode and may have been after the 3rd run, his wife Pauline was not amused to see a crowd of sweaty, muddy and thirsty ladies, but eventually joined in the fun. When asked "why don't you Hash", she said, "my tennis is enough", but she eventually caught the bug and joined us becoming Hash Secretary for a time. Thereafter On Ons became a regular feature. I can remember many at Changi in Annabelle Tame's house and also Harrison Swinson's. As numbers were still fairly small it was quite easy to cater for and for several years Harriets' homes were the venue for On Ons. Audrey and Des Holloway held some super On Ons, bill of fare nearly always being Curry. Another great curry maker was Kamela Chellam, who is still running today, and hopefully making those delicious curries.

Attire.

The attire in the beginning was much the same as today, shorts, tee shirts, running shoes etc. the only difference probably being that we didn't have Hash tee shirts until Run No. 50, this was not sponsored. Our first sponsored tee shirt was Run 100 by Soon Douglas. A company owned by Mary Jane Soon and Graham Douglas, who are still Hashing.

Records.

There are no records before Run 12. I rang everybody up each week, which was quite a task especially as the numbers grew. Eventually the Mens' Secretary agreed to put our run details onto their notice. This did in fact enlarge the membership as the mens' wives now became aware of our existence and wanted to join in the fun. We gradually established a nucleus who never failed to turn up. New members came and went but although somewhat small in numbers we survived without too much trouble.

Newsletter.

2nd April No. 24

The reason for having our own notice is that on the mens' Hash had a new Secretary, Derek Morris, his first action was to oust us from the notice. He had in fact told me that he would do this when he became secretary, but I had taken it with 'a pinch of salt', so I was staggered when it did occur. I also had a lot of problems with John O'Rourke who is still their Grand Hash Master, we argued for hours over the reasons for Ladies running, I believe that they just wanted running, or rather Hashing, to be a men only event. This made me all the more determined to get and keep Harriets running. Once we were firmly established and the men could see that it was not affecting their running, in fact some even admitted that our On Ons were better than theirs! things did quieten down somewhat. In fact John O'Rourke did run with us and even laid some horrible runs, expect he was testing us out.

Anyway having had our Hash news ousted I was in a real quandry as to how to get the notice duplicated. The problem was solved by one of the Harriet's husbands arranging to duplicate it on a machine at the office. I had to type the stencil, take it down to be run off, collect it later, type the envelopes, fold the notice, place in envelope, stamp it and then mail it. This used to take me all day Thursday. Previously the notice had been duplicated and mailed by the Flying Club who have always processed the Mens' notice.

This procedure continued until I managed to find 2 Hash Mistresses to take over. Jennifer Fraser was a school teacher and had access to a Banda machine, she with Mary Ann Riddell made an excellent team, with one writing and typing the notice and the other duplicating and mailing out. This was a welcome relief for me. It was these 2 girls who decided that I should be made Grand Hash Mistress and it was unanimously accepted by all Harriets.

Of course it wasn't always possible to find new Secretaries with access to duplicating facilities, so it was eventually decided to purchase a portable duplicating machine. This I did through Gestetner, the machine was second hand and cost around \$100, or it may have been less.

HISTORY OF THE SINGAPORE HASH HOUSE HARRIETS.



We began because (as a lot of us can remember) "necessity was the mother of invention". We weren't the first lot of harriets to be formed I'm reliably told, but we weren't far off. History books tell me we were the 5th or the 6th group of ladies to form a club worldwide

When we had our first run in October 1973 we decided to shed the yokes of womanhood and ban tea parties in favour of joining our menfolk on the hash trail. This was, of course, a case of: If you can't beat 'em, join 'em. At first the Harriets were not impressed, in fact they were quite shocked at our intrusion into their world, and did their best to dissuade us. Perish the thought of a bunch of women thrashing through our jungles they thought! Verbally abused but undaunted, we decided we could do it ourselves and it has been a great success.

Give credit where due, we did have considerable assistance and guidance from some of the harriers of the time. They showed us the secrets of setting good hash trails and we were invited to put our hash run information in their weekly newsletter until we got our own going.

It is a fact that girls love hashing as much as do the fellows but being the softer sex, there are some things we do not handle as well. These include snarling kampong dogs, snakes, and other "wazzats", shaggy pits and rock climbing. So even though the men didn't want us on their run we were delighted for them to join us. In fact we generously give a small award for the most chivalrous male.

Our constitution allows for 85 females and 40 male associate members. We regularly get between 10 and 20 guests at our weekly runs on Wednesdays. We recently celebrated two special events. Our 13th birthday and our 700th run. Some of these bigger celebrations have attracted in excess of 300 hashers.

When the club was young and membership was around 30-40, the ones were mostly held in harriets homes. Now they are mostly on site BBQ's etc. with the odd swinging party at an assortment of eating houses.

Our first G.H.M. and founder Caryl Gurney who worked very hard in the early years to keep the club going. She still keeps in touch from her home and hashing grounds in the U.K.. When our records

1

were ^{first} put on paper by Zabi Burt and Jane Bodner in the 70's the fees were 50 cents per week. The newsletter was stencilled and run off by coeditors Jennifer Frazer and Mary Ann Ridell. As per hash tradition, the hares used to organize the beer and ice but by our 100th run we arranged for the F&N beer wagon to follow us (Like the men did) and this truck has become as much a part of hashing as anything. The 100th run also saw the first sponsored T-shirt, thanks to the great partnership of MaryJane Soon and Graeme Douglas.

A lot of good fun and good friendships have been made over the years and we've seen every inch of Singapore. The club has produced some excellent and hardworking committees and we look forward to many more years of the same during which we will foster the true spirit of hashing for the softer sex.



PLEASE KEEP THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IN-MIND WHEN YOU ARE LAYING A RUN:

1. **Planning** - Go out at least a week before the actual run and plan out the course. For a 3 mile run - walk for approx. 1 1/2 hours.
2. **Laying the trail** - Guard against sickness or other incapacity by ensuring that you have a posse who knows the run and who has been on the recy with you.
Runs should start at 5.45. It is not advisable to have a long run in November or May when there is an early sunset.
Take plenty of trail laying material and start an hour ahead of the Harriets. Lay a direct trail from your car for about a 1/4 mile before your first check - this helps latecomers to catch up with the pack.
If your trail is along a road use chalk arrows. Put them where vehicles and people's feet will not scuff them off.
Two or three good checks are preferable to six half-hearted ones. Indicate checks clearly by dropping a burst of paper or writing 'check' in chalk. The trail must resume within 50 yards in open country and 25 yards in rough bush.
False trails should not exceed 15 yards.
If you go through a kampong it must be a straight run without checks on the most obvious course. No checks in the last half mile, please.
Remember it may be getting dark towards the end of your run, therefore lay the trail thicker towards the end, and also in jungle and overgrown areas, so as to minimise the chance of unscheduled jungle survival exercises.
3. **Duties 2 weeks before run** - Give the venue to the Secretary 2 weeks in advance of your run along with a 'witty' Hash circular, if possible. Please also do your best to suggest a suitable location for an 'ON ON'.
4. **OTHER DUTIES** - Collect the Hash sign, trail material, cups, cool box and ice packs from the previous week's hare.
Wash the mug. Order beer and food.



HINTS ON HASHING

How to Organise a Run and Run Friends at the Same Time

BEFORE

1. Secure the assistance of an experienced co-hare. Be sure that he/she knows the run and can take over in case of sickness.
2. Plan and prepare the run well in advance.
3. Avoid, where possible, having a main road bisecting the run.
4. Parking: ensure that there is sufficient parking for 20 - 30 cars at the start.
5. Distance: a final brisk walk around route should average about one mile and a half hours for a 4 mile run. (In December, when there are many runners, runs should be not more than three and a half miles). If distance is likely to fall be sure that trail is on a clear track back to cars.
6. Advice on See of map reference 1 week in advance.

DURING THE RUN

7. Start at least one hour before official start at 5.45 p.m.
8. CHECKS: Lay paper from your car for approx. 1/4 mile before start. Check (hills late-comers catch up). Never in a lamp. Not to exceed 100 yds from trail in open country, 25 yds in built-up areas. Police trails not to exceed 25 yds. Do check if 'in' and 'out' trail are close together. Do check after darkness. Do check within 1/2 mile of finish. Between 1 and 5 GOOD checks per run.
9. PAPER: Use sparingly as throughout, build up across. Use chalk where practicable. Use lightly in difficult country, uninhabited areas, towards end of run, (especially on single paths). Use discretion in converse, private property etc. Do not leave paper.
10. Arrange suitable place for On On and try to bargain down price of beer without complaint.

RUNNING

1. Run on paper about 100 yds. or so.
2. At about 100 yds. Run out and look for new trail. If you hear AND TALK about CHECKING.
3. When new trail is found about 100 yds. Run out and look for new trail. If you hear AND TALK about CHECKING.
4. Do not turn back from a run and go home without letting one person out.

NOTE

Keys are the only means of checking that everyone has returned safely. You are responsible for the passengers in your car. If you have one or two keys be sure that someone knows you are running. 





Mary Jane Douglas is our longest running active member. As Mary Jane Soon, her first run was at the cricket club very early on. We have that recorded as run # 11—Wednesday 2nd January 1974, "6 times around the Padang".


Mary Jane was named by the Harriets at run # 937 on the 24th July 1991. From the circle report 'Mary Jane will be henceforth be known as CONFUCIUS for her sagacious adage "If you run slow, you'll do all the short cuts."

I sat down with Mary Jane recently to ask her about the early days.

The early runs were set by the men who were willing to help. Ratnam set the first run, and other early helpers from HHHS were Peter Noad and John Sheridan.

There were no circles in the early days, people just sat around and talked. Mary Jane's husband, Graeme, thought the circle was started by Lion City Hash which he nick-named the Billy Graham hash due to all the hoo-hah of the circle.

Mary Jane thought the Dick and Tits were introduced in the late '80's during Eileen Davies time as GM (ed: 1991). Hash names were thought to be introduced



at the same time (ed: also 1991). The famous committee F\$%k Me Shoes were probably introduced by Anne Miles (Indianus).

Having run since the very beginning, Mary Jane has seen a lot of changes in Singapore. She and Graeme lived in Windsor Drive off Somapah Road, both of which are expunged (quintessential Singapore) now (although rumour has it that Somapah Road is making a comeback). This area is now Changi Business Park and they were very close to the coast. Graeme talks about waking up one morning to earth-moving machinery, which over time led to about 1km of additional land being added between them and the shore.

There was lot of jungle, Kampong, and rubber plantation in the early days. Sembawang, Pasir Panjang, and Ponggol were great places to run with little development. There used to be cows on a farm in Bedok Corner which is now a Cold Storage. There was development going on though, and one of the things you had to watch out for was houses would be torn down but the outside sh\$thouse would not be closed in, you could be running along and find yourself in the wrong type of hole—hares apparently took great delight in setting trail directly over the dis-used lav.

Kamela (Sybil) was another early runner and she was very fast in the early days, although she would often say "I am not running well today" before disappearing into the distance. Kauko Savolainen used to run in bare feet.

Thanks Mary Jane for the memories and all your contributions over the years.



Sybil

What do you need to know about Kamela Chellam (Sybil). A small sampling of photos will tell you a lot.

Completely revered in the Harriets, Kamela has run further than anyone. The 2,000th run will be her 1,096th run with the Harriets, outpacing Loose Change, Hooray, and Boo, all in the 800's. She started very early, exactly when we aren't sure, but the first official record is of her haring run #25 on 10th April, 1974.



As noted by Confucius, Kamela was a genuine FRB in the early days. She was renowned for Curry on ons, her banter with Armless was a constant source of laughter, and no-one who has seen it will ever forget an episode of her showing her belly in the circle. And, as so well put in the Lion City 25th anniversary magazine "is so well respected by the hash that we always honor her by always making sure she is always the highest person when she is in the circle talking" (example below).







Jo/Not Tonight (with Stiffy at a Deepavali Run October 2005)

1st Run - January 1996 I arrived from UK on a Wednesday around 16:00 and ran my first Harriet's run that night at Rail Mall.

Hash Name: It is not because I said "Not Tonight " when asked to pay that first night! It is because my name is Josephine and Napoleon did not recommend men to do it before taking strenuous exercise. Stiffy was named later - at a run at the Australian High Commision, Singapore - when he ran in a kangaroo skin with his tail reinforced with coat hanger wire.

My favourite runsite is Kent Ridge where I was hare for my 60th Birthday - I was first to set a run over the 3 Peaks from Kent Ridge, over the new Alexandra walkway linking Alkaff Mansion, Henderson Waves bridge over to Mt Faber and back. Stiffy served champagne in Hort park and a big group of US Seamen were very impressed by us harriets (especially Sybil) for going so far! At the circle I became a big breasted blonde hare and given appropriate presents for the elderly and a cake. On on was on-site Dehli serving curry with a sea view (you could still see sea from Kent Ridge in those days). Who would want 'special' birthdays on anything but a Hash night?!

Loose Change

First run: 1987 Dover Road Car Park

Hash Name: Grovelling around under a soft drinks vending machine for Loose Change in Dempsey Road because all around were drying of thirst as the beer truck was late!

Favourite run site: Dempsey Road

In the early days the Harriet's didn't used to go to Lion City because they were shy and it wasn't the 'done thing' but not so shy to do our own On-On's at good old Palms Wine Bar in HV with Sandy Macintosh (To Do Ron Ron), Jill Shulte (Hard Lay), Black Widow and Sain Jones, plus men of course!

Back in the '80's when we had a big open truck we had to use a big set of detachable wooden steps to climb up on to the truck for down-downs' and some poor sod had to take the steps home with them every week. Well one week, Slack Arse & I forgot about the steps in the back of the car and got stopped at the Causeway customs trying to explain why we needed to import these beer-soaked steps into Malaysia!



Big Head

First run with Harriets - August 2003 - it was Posh Duck's birthday run from Jalan Kampong Chantek, the On On was at the British Club, I had been invited by Public Zipp and Herr Zipp, Confucius was our GM, and remember I showered at Father Anus's car; it rained before and during the run. Hashers feared I might not return because the run was so wet and there was a lot of shiggy. Needless to say, I did return and have been a member since.

My hash name came from the Harriets 30th Anniversary Party - it was a 70's theme party held on East Coast. No one really knew me at the time because I had only run with the Harriets a few times at that point. As most now know, I enjoy dancing and dressing up. This particular night I wore a big wig and danced the night away in my platform shoes. It was a mystery to most there that evening, who I was (I actually was given an award that night as having the 'Most Hash Spirit'). The following weeks, after much discussion (as does happen in a hash circle), I was named 'Big Head'. The person who initiated my naming was Zipp.

Favourite run site: I enjoy jungle runs with a bit of a challenge - most

I met my lovely husband on the Hash.

My first hash run was with Harriets in November 2004 at Geylang. I had met Pantsalone in a bar and she sent me the run location every week from June to November until I finally showed up. Someone asked me what I thought of the run and I said "flat and easy" which might have been a hash name if I wasn't a virgin. I was charged for looking for flat and easy in Geylang.

Shoe Shopper named me —she was charging the blind bastards with glasses and saw me whip my glasses off and hence I was Sneaky Comer. I got my revenge a few weeks later with a shoe related charge.





The Tits



According to the newsletter 'Thanks to Jenny Moon we now have a weekly "Boob Award", to be worn by the recipient on the run and at the On On'. Jill Cutchee was also the first recipient! We have gone through many pairs of tits over the years, one wonders what happens to them.

And for these characters, Dick or Tits alone were insufficient reward—if only we could remember their sins. Or be bothered to dig out the newsletter.





Miss Sporty was introduced in March 1991, and originally was to make sure you "behaved on the run (Newsletter 915). The award seems to have been a kiss from Alan Barnes. The first recipient was Rick Ussher, apparently for leaving his pregnant wife behind to come to the hash. The following week it went to Ray Ang for running in front and not calling (nothing new there)

However, a very inadequate and incomplete search of the records suggests that the formal practice of applying lipstick to men caught running in front started in 1988, at run # 1287. The new committee with GM Karen Bishop (Cookie) had a "Front Runners" charge in the newsletter for run # 1288, which became "The Lipstick Award" in newsletters from # 1291. The first recipients were Watergasam & Butt Sucker and were charged by Indianus. It should be no surprise to anyone reading that in the short number of following weeks, lipstick was applied to Ad Nauseum, Stiffy, and Hooray (3 times in 4 weeks). Hooray has done 885 runs and has probably had lipstick 800 times. Why I can't find a photo of him with lipstick is beyond me.



There's no point complaining boys, right or wrong, sooner or later you will be lipsticked. Just be thankful they got rid of that toxic bright red one that took paint thinner to get it off.



Sometimes it will be wrong. Last week I got lipsticked for coming to the circle in a taxi, having been unable to make the run. I was sitting a few cm in front of my wife, apparently. Should have put her in the front seat. Not that I'm holding a grudge. And sadly, with Goodie Bag an infrequent attender now, the days of having your lipstick applied mouth to mouth are gone. Sigh.

Other Historical Trivia

FIRST USE OF HASH NAMES—1991?

It isn't completely clear when Harriets started using hash names. Newsletter 920 (March 1991) mentions Lynx (Lynne Higgins). 921 mentions Sybil (Kamela Chellam) and that Alan Barnes was christened at the circle as "Done That" - "Been There's side kick", which implies Sally Barnes already had a hash name at that time. Newsletter 921 also listed the hash names of the committee members for the first time, for those that had names (Hot Pants (Eileen Davies), Deep Purple (Hilary Pretten), and Kanga (Di Reddekopp)). There was then a flurry of naming at run 925 on the 1st May 1991. By run 934 (3rd July 1991) everyone on the committee had a hash name.

Were introduced when and by whom? According to Confucius it was Indianus who introduced the **requirement** for the committee to wear FMS at the circle. Cookie says Lynx had something to do with it. Sadly it is a rule more honored in the breach.

A favorite memory is of Kamela charging Dances with Kerbs for wearing F\$%k You Boots.

Ladies , when you do wear them the boys bow down!

The tutu, the whinger's baby bottle, the whip, the lipstick bag—all have been introduced and used sporadically over the last five years or so.

The tutu was introduced in 2008 when Suzee Wong was GM. Always given to men who had done something noteworthy, it was lost for a while after being given to Ratnam (right) at Boo's Big Birthday run in 2010. It eventually came back and is used occasionally.

The whip was introduced at the same time as a means of enforcing discipline but it didn't really take on. Nor did the baby bottle (whinger of the week) which was bloody hard to skol having two big holes, one of which poured beer on you.



Breast Cancer Awareness Run


